MISSING BREAKFAST CLUB?

Here is a yummy LMCA Breakfast Club favourite that you can try at home...

EASY CROCKPOT BREAKFAST CASSEROLE

Grease the inside of a crockpot with margarine or butter. Pour in one bag of frozen hashbrowns and 1-2 cups of whatever vegetables your family likes (onions, broccoli, spinach, peppers, mushrooms etc.) Beat 12 eggs with half a cup of milk and pour over hash browns and vegetables. Sprinkle 1-2 cups grated cheese on top. Place lid on the crockpot and cook on low temperature for 6-8 hours. This can also be baked in a large casserole dish in the oven for 1-1.5 hours at 375°F. It is extra delicious served with a side of hollandaise sauce. Enjoy!

LANGLEY MEADOWS COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION KEEPING YOUR COMMUNITY SAFE

I have always been impressed (and a bit envious) of how community oriented you folks are in the Langley Meadows area. You have the community school and so many green spaces making Langley Meadows neighbourhood unique and family oriented. Langley Meadows is a tucked away

little gem in the hustle and bustle of the Township of Langley. It is not surprising that crime statistics are at an all-time low in your community and have continued to decline since 2016!

The declining trend may surprise you so let's talk about more about what crime trends and statistics entail. Crime statistics are based on the number of calls made to the Langley RCMP for calls for service. I often hear from residents that they have witnessed suspicious activity in the area but do not want to bother the Langley RCMP with a call. **PLEASE CALL!** I cannot stress this enough. If you do not make the call then we cannot track crime which will reflect in the stats at the end of the year.

What number to call? Please utilize **911** if you fear for anyone's safety and it is happening in the moment. If you are calling after the fact or it is something that just gets your "Spidey" senses going then call the **non-emergency line 604-532-3200**.

Please remember that reporting on Facebook is not reporting to the RCMP.

Join **BLOCKWATCH**. There are only two active Blockwatches in the Langley Meadows area. The objective of the Blockwatch program is to get residents networking with each other to share information on crime prevention and to reduce crime. Facebook groups are great but are not monitored by the Langley RCMP. We do support and endorse Blockwatch. Please call **604-532-3213** for more information on Blockwatch.

Some other "Tips" to help reduce crime:

1. Know your neighbours and who is supposed to be in the area
2. LOCK YOUR CAR AND TAKE EVERYTHING OUT
3. Report, report, report to the Langley RCMP
4. Record serial numbers of items such as bikes, tools, phones etc
5. Put away tools, equipment, kids toys etc
6. Ensure your address is visible and residence is well lit
7. Shred any personal documents
